Abstract

The MGHPCC is a high-performance computing datacenter built to support the research computing needs of five Boston area universities: MIT, BU, Northeastern, Harvard and UMass. The center is a public/private venture and was constructed with funds from the five universities, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Cisco and, DellEMC. The MGHPCC is a unique regional resource enabling collaborative research and discovery for thousands of scientists at our member institutions as well as state and community sponsored projects. We're also home to the MOC! This talk will provide an overview of the facility, some of the projects that are underway there and we'll touch on "what's new" at the datacenter since the last MOC workshop.
